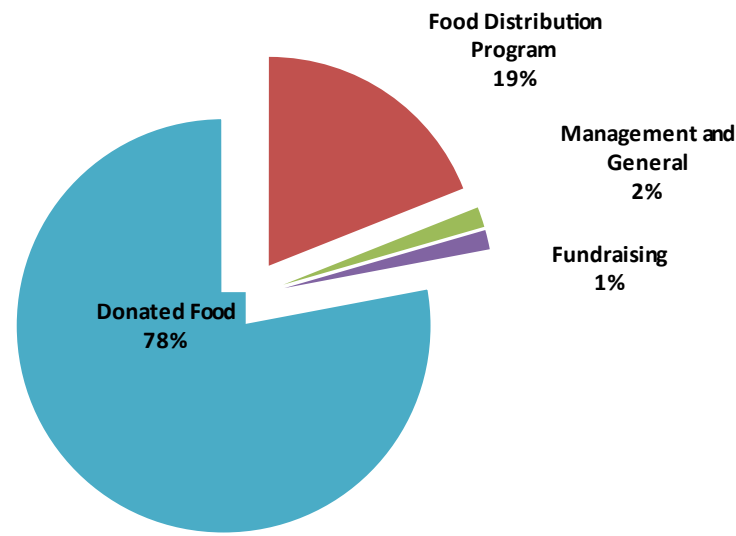
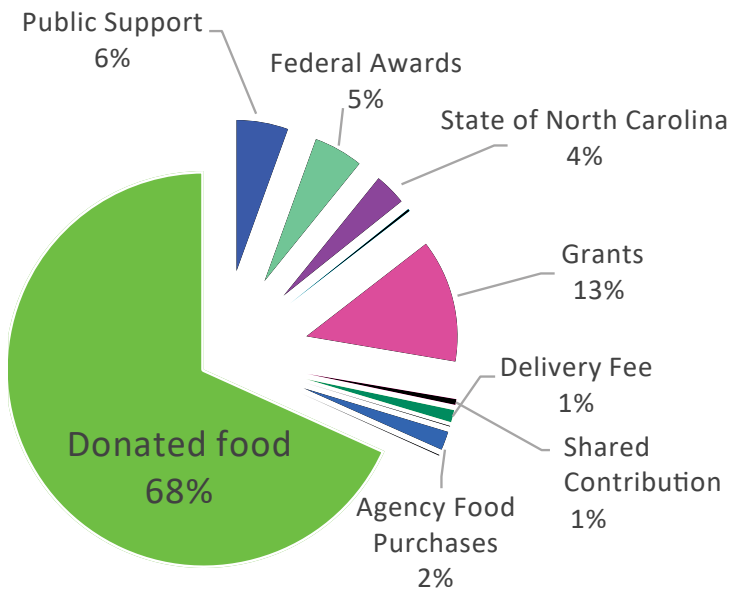

## Dear Friends and Partners:

The past year was like no other in the Food Bank of the Albemarle's 38 year history, having distributed 7.4 million pounds of food across our 15-county service area; a 17% increase over the same 12 months in 2019. This report is a snapshot of what we accomplished with your support from July 2019 – June 2020.



Six months into our new fiscal year July 2020 – December 2020, the upturn on our services is now 42% above the same period in 2019.

As of December 2019, more than 15% of residents that called northeast North Carolina home, relied on one of our hunger relief network partners supported by the Food Bank for food assistance. With the outbreak of COVID-19, that number has increased to an estimated 50,410 or 16% with more than 16,170 or 26% representing children. This increase is due to the economic impact felt across the area due to employment lay-offs, reduction in work hours, school closures, and business closures that will last years.

Your outpouring of support, enabled us to ramp up our food distributions to meet the increased need, providing hope to the thousands of additional families that needed our services for the first time. Every time Food Bank of the Albemarle is faced with a challenge, you are there to ensure that our neighbors continue to receive food no matter the circumstance.

The world as we know it may be forever changed, but I hope your commitment will stay the same. Food Bank of the Albemarle will continue its mission to feed our hungry neighbors and work to solve hunger issues in our community every day so that one day our community can be hunger free!

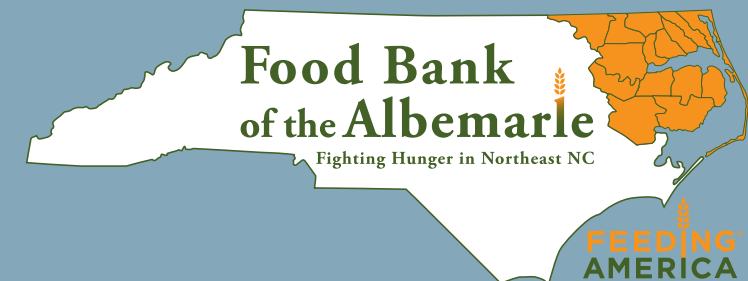

# Addressing the Need

Feeding hungry women, children, veterans, seniors, and families, seven days a week.

## CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAMS

### After-School Snack Program

**26,532** snacks were provided to children in 9 separate before and after-school programs in Pasquotank County.

### Backpack Program

During FY20, **94,338** meals were provided at 9 schools to children who were at risk of hunger during the weekend.

## NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

### NC Nutrition Assistance Program

Through state grants, Food Bank of the Albemarle augmented efforts to provide healthy nutritious food by distributing an additional **559,474** meals to those in need.

### USDA TEFAP Program

The Emergency Food Assistance Program helps provide food to low-income families and individuals by distributing surplus food to each state, which is then used by food banks to feed the hungry. Through this program, the Food Bank of the Albemarle provided **1,149,402** meals to more than **70,000** households in FY20.

**FNS Outreach** The Food Bank of the Albemarle assists our clients with SNAP (formerly known as the Food Stamp Program) applications and trains hunger relief partners to assist with applications as well. Through this program, **378** applications were received, equal to **637,757** meals!

### Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) is a federally funded program that provides monthly food packages of USDA commodities to seniors. In FY20, **917,563** meals were served to **2,880** seniors over 60 years old with an income less than 130% of poverty.

## DIRECT SERVICES

**Albemarle Food Pantry** - The Food Bank's in-house pantry served those in need from Pasquotank and Camden counties. During FY20, the Albemarle Food Pantry served **7,966** households (**14,481** members). This is a **24% increase** over the previous year - with **8% of the increase** representing new clients.

## MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

The Mobile Food Pantry distributed **1.3 Million lbs.**, over **1.1 Million meals** to **98,193** people in need in **11** counties during FY20. The MFP program targets remote areas and those that lack a fixed facility.

## DISASTER RELIEF SUPPORT

Food Bank of the Albemarle is prepared to handle disaster situations, and work directly with local emergency management operations in providing food, water, and hygiene items during crisis situations. During FY20, we provided **22,000 lbs.** of nutritious emergency food to residents of Currituck, Dare, and Hyde Counties, in response to Hurricane Isaias.
